



POINT TO POINT TRANSPORT DRIVERS FOLLOWING THE LAW AT EVEREST

The Point to Point Transport Commissioner Anthony Wing said he was pleased to see that levels of compliance with point to point transport law were high at the Everest Horse Race this weekend at Royal Randwick Racecourse.

The Commissioner's on-street compliance team sent a number of officers out to conduct checks on taxis and hire vehicles outside Royal Randwick Racecourse, to ensure that the industry is providing the safest possible service at all times.

"Our officers inspected over one hundred vehicles this weekend and I am pleased to see that most drivers of point to point transport were compliant with the law.

"A total of 24 Penalty Notices were issued to taxi drivers for not clearly displaying their driver identity document (21) and for hire vehicles for not displaying a retroreflective sign (3).

"Our on-street compliance activity is a vital part of ensuring the safety of patrons using point to point transport to get to and from the venue," he said.

Penalty Notices are issued when drivers are in breach of the point to point transport law or safety standards.

The high compliance rate and small number of notices issued during the compliance activity is a good indicator of safe point to point transport services.
