Security Camera Systems

This checklist is to be used as a guide for ongoing compliance with the point to point transport law and for onboarding or re-onboarding drivers.

Approved security camera systems checklist

This checklist is specific to taxi service providers who provide rank and hail services (ply and stand for hire) in NSW.

This safety standard is specified for the vehicle owner however the service provider, and other identified persons, are responsible for ensuring compliance. For a list of all responsible persons, please refer to the <u>Point to Point Transport (Taxis and Hire Vehicles)</u> Regulation 2017.

Camera system Does or is the camera:			
	Boot in less than 45 seconds		
	Record for 30 minutes after turning off the vehicle's ignition		
	When turned on, self-check for faults, including ensuring an image can be taken		
	Visually indicate to driver when working or not working The driver must be able to see this from the seated driver position		
	Work when the taxi is available for hire, even if the ignition is not turned on		
	Visible to passengers in the vehicle		
	Unable to be turned off or disabled by an unauthorised person		
	Impact and shock resistant, withstand typical car vibrations and a typical car accident		

Allow images to be recovered following loss of power to the camera system
Record continuously and store images for not less than 30 days and not more than 90 days after the recording was made
Record automatically and continues over older images when at full recording capacity Keep in mind that images must be stored and kept according to the regulation.
Conform to the following electromagnetic conformance standards:
Radio disturbance test methods ISO 10605:2008 and ISO 7637-2:2011 and AS/NZS CISPR 25:2010
Have connection points and components mounted to the exterior of a taxi must meet or exceed the IP67 rating
Work in temperatures of -5C to + 60C and humidity of 0% to 85%

Camera system footage			
Does or is the footage:			
	Show the driver and the head and shoulders of all passengers.		
	This must comply with section 3.7 of Australia Standards AS 4806.2-2006 (CCTV)		
	Provide views of any person approaching from five metres from both the driver's and front passenger's window, with an angle of 120 degrees from the centre of the door		
	Internal - Show focused images from 300mm to three metres		
	External - Show focused images from 300mm to five metres		
	Set at a minimum of five frames per second		
	Recorded on non-volatile memory and only be able to be accessed or removed by an authorised person		
	Recorded a minimum of 360 pixels per metre both horizontally and vertically		
	Recorded and stored in colour or with a minimum of 256 greyscale levels		
	Resolution and clarity maintained under all lighting conditions from darkness (0 lux) through to bright sunlight (100,000 lux)		
	Have imprinted on them the following metadata (without obstructing the view of any occupant in a seated position in the vehicle): • the vehicle registration number; and • date and time in UTC* within one second; and • location in coordinates accurate to 25 metres *Australian Eastern Standard Time (AEST; UTC+10:00)		

Acc	essing images and software
ls o	r does the software:
	Accessible for authorised persons
	Operate on an off-the-shelf computer, or the supplier must provide a download system to the monitoring facility
	Password protected and stored footage encrypted to prevent unauthorised viewing, recovery or reproduction of footage
	Stored in one or several of the following: on the hard drive of a computer in logical pools across disparate commodity servers located on premises in a data centre managed by a third-party cloud provider
	Allow footage to be accessed from, or made available in, NSW

Note:

You will need to be able to show in an audit, or on request, that your security camera system meets the specifications outlined in the Regulation. You should be able to demonstrate that the supplier has provided confirmation their system is compliant with these specifications.
