Authorisation Fees

The next authorisation fee period is coming up.

If you are still authorised as of 1 July 2021 you will be required to pay the annual authorisation fee for the 2021-22 financial year, even if you undertake no trips during the period.

These fees have been adjusted by CPI for the 2021/22 financial year and are listed on our [website](#). The authorisation fee amount is based on the number of passenger service transactions you carry out in that financial year. If you are authorised to provide both taxi and booking services, the passenger service transactions for each authorisation are combined.

If you are not currently providing point to point transport services and you do not wish to be liable for the 2021/22 authorisation fee you should consider surrendering your authorisation before 1 July 2021 in the [Industry portal](#).

COVID -19 Update

The COVID-19 situation has been evolving rapidly, currently mask wearing is mandatory in Point to Point Transport for all of NSW. More information on face masks can be found [here](#).

Stay-at-home orders have been extended across all of Greater Sydney including the Blue Mountains, Central Coast, Wollongong and Shellharbour until 11.59pm Friday, 9 July.

Before the courts: Driver receives significant fine and conviction for failing to display their driver ID

On 16 June 2021, a Magistrate sentenced a taxi driver to a conviction and \$1,600 fine at the Local Court at Sydney Downing Centre for failing to display a driver identity document (driver ID) while providing rank and hail passenger services.
